#### Update on yesterday's Science SC meeting

• Purpose of meeting:

To pull out important take-aways from the meeting

To determine points of agreement/divergence

Ways that this might influence our work going forward.

- Key Takeaways:
  - there is a desire from this group to see EAs rather than CEs done in the future.
  - there are questions about how departure analysis is conducted, esp as related to HRV Nathan offered to lead that discussion
  - didn't identify any lacking data sources re: ecological resilience
  - could use a layer that talks about snags
  - could use a layer for recreational attributes
  - could use a layer looking at carbon sequestration
- There are varying levels of discomfort with model inputs

- FS Cmt: we would like collaborative members to get these details understood so that we all have a common understanding, and so that we all know we're working from the same facts.
- FS Cmt: If you want to influence the process you need some context & understanding. If you want us to do something other than our original vision we need to know
  - the level of support among stakeholders
  - clear reasons for other perspectives

#### **Operating Principles**

- This is about setting out our intentions in working together Three key questions
  - Why Are You (and Your Organization) at the "Collaborative Table"?
  - What Has Kept You Coming Back?
  - What Will Keep You at The Table, in the Future?

#### Part One: Small group exercise

- Three small break-out groups that will not be recorded.
  - Will create responses to very short 1-word & simple phrase responses.
  - Those will go into word clouds
  - 15 minutes per question
- Results: See attached word clouds at the end of these meeting notes.
  - NOTE: The first cloud was not complete, due to several groups not being able to upload their responses (we hit the limit, before they were uploaded). The major additions to that first cloud are "forest health", "civility", "direct proactive input", "common ground", and "collective vision".

#### Part Two: Discussion of Proposed new Operating Principles in light of Part One

- Looked at both the old WW & Umatilla Mission stmts.
   Compared them to the present proposed statement.
- not really collaborative any more
  - Are we only hosting civil conversations?

#### - Why Are You (and Your Organization) at the "Collaborative Table"?

- Understanding among a diverse group of stakeholders
- Suggestions: perhaps we should ask:

Where are we falling short ... What are the barriers?

- we aren't diverse
- we're not confronting disagreements in a constructive fashion
- CFLRP brought a LOT of folks together that aren't coming to the collaborative meetings.
  - Why not? Why aren't they coming?

Frustration ... the group is not making progress on issues. "high-centered"

- Suggestion: We should ask people to come back after we get the process done.
- Barriers to environmental group involvement:
  - limited time & resources
  - FS is doing a lot of things like CEs that aren't taking into account collaborative agreements
  - Env. needs are not being met. OR Wild is not all about veg projects

- Don't see the reciprocity. People who have said "OR Wild doesn't belong"
- Districts that aren't here aren't carrying out the principles we've agreed to
- Some environmental groups are skeptical of collaboration generally because they feel that
  - Collaboration shouldn't be a substitute for NEPA (Farm Bill)
  - Don't agree that forests are unhealthy, or that logging is the only solution.
  - some groups have been co-opted by other interests
- Why be here?
  - Aspiration. A better way forward.
- What's really our niche as a collaborative?
  - it's not Wilderness ... don't need a collaborative for that.
  - it's about the active mgmt parts of the Forest.
- Nils' barriers/concerns
  - collaborative was generating broad-spectrum *mutual* values and the optimism that's generated from finding that.
  - we've lost common ground, lost the ability to move forward
  - need to get re-aligned.
  - Our time needs to be more than just respectful dialogue.
  - We also need constructive progress.
- Ideal: productive relationships ... rather than just relationships
- Suggestion: Acknowledge some common shared values that we all support
  even if they're not the focus for our work (unless there's some clear & present risk to our work.)
  - EG: We all value Wilderness. so that it's clear that this isn't active mgmt for the entire NF.
  - natural processes should be recognized ... disturbance adapted landscapes.
- WR is a part of large restoration work efforts.
  - There's not controversy around that.

We need some sort of agreement on what's important.

- We've had some good accomplishments
  - East Face: the decision was deeply influenced by the conversations.
  - Glass was a good project.
  - Thomas Creek was a good project.
- Cmt: seems that many env. concerns stem from what's happening outside of this room

EG: The Farm Bill CEs.

Resp: A lot of the public can't realistically participate in collaboratives.

That's not democratically appropriate.

• What is the productive space for a collaborative?

It's not the "winner-take-all" kinds of problems

IT's the places where creative solutions can create better than average outcomes.

Where these kinds of solutions exist, we can leverage resources to get things done.

Suggestion: Think about a more integrated approach to how projects are implemented.

Like the strategic planning on the Umatilla ... make it clear what all the benefits are.

Would be good to look at the larger suite of values
